Dear Ernest:

This is to confirm your report of reception of WUWF 88.1 FM. The data you supplied was correct for 10:27 AM (CDT) to 11:02:30 AM on Sunday, June 26, 1994.

WUWF broadcasts on 88.1 MHz with a transmitter output of 100,000 watts. We are licensed as a Class C-1 non-commercial FM station by the Federal Communications Commission and operate with a non-directional 8-bay antenna 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

Our transmitter and tower are located in Midway, Florida, approximately midway between Pensacola and Fort Walton Beach, Florida. Our antenna is located directly on the Gulf Coast at a height of 180 meters, and as such, our signal serves as many fish as it does people. I've enclosed a coverage map for you.

WUWF began broadcasting from our studios on the campus of the University of West Florida on January 15, 1991. We are a full service, professionally staffed, National Public Radio affiliate providing the finest news, classical music, jazz, and world music. I've enclosed some brochures and a program guide for you as well.

I'm glad to hear that you volunteer at your local public radio station. Unfortunately, UWF has no band, so I'm afraid I can't help you out with a tape. Thank you for your interest in WUWF. I hope we have the opportunity to skip your way again!
