Dear Ernest,

Congratulations on receiving WYFB on April 27, 1987. You gave a very accurate description of what we aired at that time that evening. There is no doubt that it was us. If I may help you with one of the unknown frequencys you listed, we have a co-channel station that belongs to the Catholic Churches in Tampa at 90.5FM, and the call-letters are WBVM-FM. They are a 100kw station at 950 feet, and I believe they broadcast from a town west of the Tampa area known as Riverview! We at one time were only on the air untill midnight, and when we would sign-off, WBVM would come in clearly as far north as Jacksonville in stereo even! They are on 24-hours a day like us now, and their format was easy listening on the weekdays, and contempory on the weekends, with a little bit of religious here and there. Because we are known as BBN and they are WBVM, (Blessed Vergin Mother) we are often confused by folks who hear the call-letters.

Some other info that you may like, we were in Gainesville with our transmitter untill March 13 of this year when we moved to our own tower in a small town called Graham Florida, which is only a few miles southwest of the town of Starke Florida. We also aimed the antenna toward Jacksonville at that time while it was aimed totally south before which may be the reason you now can hear us at times. We plan to raise the tower from 500 feet to 700 feet, and the power from 50kw to 100kw by the end of this year. We don't have a coverage map as we are non-commercial and really don't have a need for one! I am sending a map we give out that shows the areas covered by all the stations in the network. We cover everything from Valdosta Georgia accross to Brúnswick Georgia, then south to Daytona Beach area, toward the west through Leesburg and Ocala, the north up the west coast back to Valdosta! AND ALL IN BETWEEN! This is because Florida is so FLAT and wet in area's that we can cover this large area. Well hope all this helps you.... Keep listening, Dick Weer
