Dear Mr. Cooper:

It was great to hear from you via mail this morning! I regret not making contact at the time your original letter was sent on June 8, 1982, but I simply did not receive it, or the letter was internally misrouted!

I am pleased to verify your reception of KBKB-FM STEREO which operates 24-hours per day on 101.7 MHZ with 3 KW both horizontally and vertically (C-POL) our tower is approximately 245 feet above average terrain our location. Our transmitter location is 690 feet AMSL so that will give you an idea of what a trick it is to receive a little 3 KW FM with a "short Stick" over one-thousand miles away. Good Going!

The announcer's name is Crazy Norm Pierson. We started calling him Crazy Norm because of his behavior both on the air and around the station. You will note by the letter head we are an NBC-Radio affiliate, however, at the time you heard KBKB-FM we were a mutal affiliate. We changed networks in early July when NBC went on Satcon-1. We use a 3-meter Scientific Atlanta parabolic dish to pick up Satcom-1. You asked about our next AM proof of Performance, it is tentatively scheduled for the first week in August. Write me again in July and I will pass along the specific primary and secondary proof dates.

I have enclosed some station promotional literature. Once again, I deeply regret our failure to communicate last June.
