

Dear Mr. Cooper,

This letter is to confirm your reception of WNIN FM 88.3 Mhz. Its always nice to hear from a fellow radio enthusiast from time to time. My name is Dan Jordan and Im the Assistant Cheif Engineer. Like you I am a radio enthusiast. I hold an extra class amateur radio license and SWL quite a bit. In the winter months I lister on the AM broadcast bands to see how far I can pick up, but I have never tried the FM broadcast band.

Our station runs 16Kw into a 6 bay antenna at 450 feet high. Our pattern is facing the E-NE pointing your direction so should the band open up it would be pointing in your direction.

My home equipment is a Kenwood TS-440s and 3 element beam on a 100 foot tower. Hopefully before winter I will be able to put up a folded dipole to work the lower part of the HF spectrum. A fellow ham and I are thinking of building a quad antenna for 144 Mhz band. And if we are successful I'll try some VHF listening. At 105 feet I should have some good reception.

I've never heard of any of the organizations that are on your letterhead but would be interested in hearing more about them if you would send me more information on them or send them my name and home address.

Well Ernest good luck in your DX listening and hope to hear from you again. I enclosed a QSL card with my home address on it so feel free to write to either place and I'll be glad to swap DX stories with you.
