
Dear Mr. Cooper:

This will acknowledge, with thanks, your reception report of WATD on May 13, 1981. I've checked the station logs and can verify your reception report as correct.

WATD has been on the air since December of 1977, although we've never quite managed to update our listing in Broadcasting Magazine. We operate in stereo from a site adjacent to the Marshfield Town Dump (hence the call letters WATD - We're at the dump). We have two 5 kilowatt CSI transmitters and theoretically we can switch from one to another without any delay. In real life, it takes about an hour to rewire everything. We also have a generator capable of powering the transmission plant; but, unfortunately, not the studios, which are located a couple of miles away. Most of our remote broadcasts are done by radio. The Beal House broadcasts come in on 161.70 MHz and some of the closer remote pickups are run on 450.05 MHz. We also have an automated two-way radio system which transmits on 153.35 MHz and receives on 170.15.

If you're ever in the Marshfield area, stop in and visit our studios. The coffee pot is always on and it would be a pleasure to meet you. Thanks again for your letter.
