

Dear Mr. Cooper,

This letter is to verify your reception of radio station WCUW-FM in Worcester, Massachusetts on Sunday, December 23, 1979. We broadcast with an effective radiated power of 630 watts at a frequency of 91.3 MHz. Surprisingly, we broadcast with a directional antenna pattern which has a 15 dB null due east, to protect WDJM at Framingham State College. However, they were most likely off the air at the time you received WCUW, as the school was on vacation for the holidays. Nonetheless, it is great to find that our modest signal reaches out to the tip of the cape. Thanks a lot for your reception report. I have enclosed a map of our lmv contour, which as you can see barely covers the towns surrounding Worcester. Our signal has been reported as clearly receivable as far away as Putnum, Connecticut and various places in southern New Hampshire - its great to have listeners at that distance.

I don't know what Tom has told you of WCUW, but I have enclosed a copy of our program guide as well. We are a community-oriented listener supported non-commercial station serving (mostly) the residents of the Worcester area with a wide variety of musical and non-musical programming, as our program listings show. At any rate, thanks again for your letter and the best in the new year.
