Dear Mr. Cooper:

I was pleased to receive your reception report of WJFD-FM on March 30, 1988. From our logs I can confirm that you did receive our broadcast at approx 10:00 AM on this date.


I am sorry that we do not have any coverage maps to send to you but as general background I can tell you WJFD is a Class 'B' 50,000 Watt FM radio station with a signal that reaches all of R.I., half way through Conn. and parts of southern New Hampshire as well as central Mass (the blue hills give us a lot of trouble to the east into Boston). We broadcast 24 hours a day from a 600 Ft tower located in Fairhaven Mass. I am sorry to tell you that because we have dual transmitters and dummy loads it is very rare to find us off the air at any time during the year.

As you noticed WJFD is all Portuguese. We have some live shows but the vast majority of our programming is recorded in house from records brought from Portugal and is run on an I.G.M. automation system. The system consists of nine (9) reel to reels and four Instacarts - each holding 48 carts. The E.B.S. test you heard is aired automatically by the controlling computer.

By the way, you are correct about "Radio Globo" being in Rio de Janeiro.
