Thanks for tuning in to WMFO on June 8, 1984. We would like to confirm that you actually did receive our signal and we are happy that every once in a while, we can be heard at the end of the Cape.


What you tuned into that night was Chuck Rossina, using the name Chuck U and the rather strange sounds are a type of Performance Radio that we broadcast one night a week, but Chuck likes to play it whenever he does a freeform show. Most of the material is homemade.

We don't have a coverage map to send you, but I can tell you that we broadcast a directional signal at 125 watts. The strongest part of the signal is pointed toward the compass bearing of 90 degrees and makes a very funny shape around Boston with the effective power to the West only about 5 watts.

Sorry that that we are so slow in responding, but people are in and out of here so much that things get lost in the shuffle. If Tom Galluzo, a former MFOer and a new person a OMR this summer, had not brought this letter to my attention it might have slipped by again.
