For your information, WSRS is one of the Knight Quality Stations, a group of AM and FM stations serving a large area of New Hampshire and Massachusetts. The other stations in the group are:

WEIM(AM)	1280 kHz	5 kW-D, 1 kW-N, DA-2	Fitchburg, MA
WSAR(AM)	1480 kHz	5 kW-U, DA-1	Fall River, MA

WSRS broadcasts with 20 kW effective radiated power, with the antenna 690 feet above average terrain, from studios and transmitter facilities atop Little Asnebumskit Hill in Paxton, Massachusetts, the site of the first FM transmitting station in New England.
