
Dear Mr. Cooper:

You did, indeed, tune us in on August 7th and hear our overnight announcer, Bob Ayres, and our morning announcer, Alice Tweedie.

I think we can give little credit to the Realistic receiver. It was the McIntosh MR-78 that enabled you to ferret out our signal where it should have been well smothered by WHOB. Once you patch an external tuner into your receiver through one of the auxilliary inputs, you have bypassed the tuner section of your receiver and are using only its preamp and amplifier sections. The amp and preamp merely augment and enhance the sound; the tuner does all the signal reception, multipath rejection and clarifying. It did very well, I must say!

Thank you for writing. It's good to know you were out there listening at 3:00 in the morning. Who'd 'a thought it?
