Dear Ernest,

Here is a letter confirming your reception of WQSS in Camden Maine on Sept. 4, 1990. The portions of programming you described in your letter were accurate. As a matter of fact we have recieved a few reports of reception from the Cape, including a formal complaint from WCRB Boston.

To give you a little history about Coast 102.5. We are a fairly new station. We signed on May 5, 1988. The original Construction Permit for the station was granted, the calls WMFT were selected, but the original company ran out of money. After about 2 years of legal battles our company won out and was granted the C.P. Within two and a half months we were on the air. Our company has 8 stations all consisting of limited partnerships. Our sister stations include, WZOU BOSTON, WLLH LOWELL LAWRENCE, WKSZ KISS 100 PHILADELPHIA, WLAM LEWISTON MAINE, WKZS AUBURN/PORTLAND MAINE, WKZN GORHAM/PORTLAND MAINE, WZSH ROCHESTER N. Y.

We are transmitting with an effective radiating power of 7900 WATTS, at a height of 1400 FEET ABOVE SEA LEVEL, from on top of Ragged Mountain in Camden. This gives us an equivalent radiating power of 50,000 WATTS. We use a 3 bay circular polarized antenna system, and a Harris FM 10K 10,000 watt transmitter. We will be adding an Harris 2.5k 2500 watt back up to our site in the next month or so. We also are equipped with an emergency 20,000 watt stand by generator in case of power failures. Overall it is a small, but efficient system redundant system, which guarantees us little down time.

Enclosed I have sent you some of our bumper stickers, balloons, and the ever popular coffee mugs. I hope you enjoy them. I thank you for letting us know about your reception. If you are ever in the area feel free to call, and I would be more than happy to show you around.
