Greetings from the Ozarks!

Thank you once again for your reception report of KSPQ, formerly known as KWPM-FM.

The call sign change was effective January 1, 1988. Programming and management felt it was time to give the FM separate identity since our AM is KWPM.

Effective January 25, 1989, we increased power on KSPQ from 77.2 Kw to a full 100 Kw with true circular polarization, at the same time increasing antenna height from 390 ft. above average terrain to 650 ft. The new tower site is fifteen miles north of West Plains near Willow Springs, Mo.


Our new transmitter is a Broadcast Electronics FM-30A running at 25 Kw feeding an 8-bay ERI antenna side mounted on a 400 feet tower on top of our mountain.

Glad to hear you're enjoying your radio work. I had the good fortune of growing up with this station. It's only four years older than I am! My dad started as an engineer/announcer in 1951 and is currently station manager. I have pictures of me attending an "official" staff function at the ripe old age of two!

It was really good to hear from you again, Ernest, and it's great to know we have a listener in Provincetown. The station owner will be happy we're getting out that far. (He was kinda' worried about our coverage with the new transmitter and all. Maybe this will boost his spirits.)
