Mr. Cooper,

It was a real pleasure to hear from you. Being a fellow radio nut, I can appreciate your fascination with having picked up our station from such a distance. As a matter of fact, I was surprised and delighted to read your letter because I didn't think, that even under the best of circumstances, we could reach that far. And I can confirm that what you heard was indeed a product of Kix country.

WKJX is a relatively new station. We signed on the air for the first time in August 1984. We initially observed broadcast hours of 6AM through midnight. Recently we changed our hours to 5AM through midnight, with a sign-off time of 1AM on Fridays and Saturdays. We hope to become a 24 hour a day station in the near future, as soon as we can hire the kind of people we feel can maintain the high standard of air quality required.

I worked for "96KIX" since day one. Beginning as an operator, (as a matter of fact I had the distinct and frightening pleasure of pulling the first air shift) and I was promoted to news/programming director last year. This is my second day at resuming my position after 3 months at WFMC in Goldsboro, WFMA/WCEC in Rocky Mount, and WRMT also in Rocky Mount. The latter two stations I still work for on weekends. (WFMA is a 100,000 watt country station, WRMT is a 1,000 watt oldies station). But I guess my heart never really left WKJX.

Thank you again, Mr. Cooper, for your letter and your kind words. I look forward to hearing from you again. I work from 5AM until 2PM, weekdays. If you would like to call, our number is (919)338-0196. I'll be more than happy to talk to you. We ran out of coverage maps, but I prepared a make-shift version for you. And while it depicts our **normal** listening area, it's nice to know we've touched someone in Provincetown Mass. Your letter was a big boost!
