Well, your reception report does coincide with our program log. You were listening to WVRM, 89.3 FM, Hazlet, New Jersey on Tuesday evening, November 27, 1984. We operate at 10 watts, at 125 feet above coverage terrain, which covers parts of Monmouth County. We also have a translator station located in Parlin, New Jersey at 91.9 FM, which covers parts Middlesex County. 
My Chief Engineer, now Mike Singer, also commented to me that, that same night he was able to pick up radio station in your area, so it must have been a fantastic night for FM reception.
