Dear Mr. Cooper:

This letter serves as your verification of WFUV on 15 May, 1980, at 5:51 PM through 6:00:15 PM. The programming that you mentioned was verified by examination of the program log for the date and time that you mentioned.

We are operating a full stereo operation from microphone input to the output of the transmitter. The transmitter is a Gates FM-20H, with an output of 18.3 Kw. The antenna is a three-bay RCA antenna, type BFG-3AG, directional 37 degrees from true north, which places the major lobe of our signal into the lower Connecticut area.

Mr. Seitz, who had been the G.M. of WFUV for 12 years, retired on June 30, 1978. As you mentioned, he was the G.M. of WFAS in White Plains at the time that you specified. Many of our former students, as well as current staff members, work at WFAS for the added commercial experience.

Enclosed please find a copy of our program guide, the Folio. This might help you figure out what we are broadcasting, if you happen to come across our signal again. Thank you for your kind letter, and we wish you the best of luck in your DX activities.
