Thanks so much for taking the time to write us at WGNA! It's great to know that you received our signal over the Cape! That's got to be over 200 miles from our transmitter site!


Some facts about our station: We broadcast 24 hours a day, with a power of 8.8 kilowatts, at 107.7 mc. Our Transmitter site is located west of Albany, in the Helderberg Mountains. We have a self-supporting tower structure. The majority of the Albany-Schenectady-Troy FM and TV stations have their towers near our location, as it's the highest point around. WGNA signed on the air in late 1973, and has programmed country music since then. Our signal reaches regularly as far east as Springfield, Mass., west as far as Utica, south to Poughkeepsie, and north above Lake George in the Adirondacks. Our sister station is WHAZ - 1330, in Troy.

Hope that the above information is helpful to you in your DX hobby. Please consider this letter as a "verification" of your report of reception. Maybe you'll get to hear us again real soon. It's a beautiful area that you live in!
