The listing in the Broadcast Yearbook has gone uncorrected since 1983 when Uncle Charlie forced us back to our original frequency. It's a long story that I wont get into but suffice to say that I'll never understand the Mass Media Bureau. The Chief Engineer listed, Chris Tobin, moved on to bigger and better things in December 1984.

Powerwise, we are running 10 gerbils in a Versa count V-322 F.M. Exciter-Transmitter. On the topside, we have a Phelps Dodge EC-FM 2 2 bay antenna sitting 160 feet above sea level.
