Thank you for your letter dated September 7, 1989. You did in fact receive SHO Radio. I find it amazing how well you received the station at the Cape.


SHO Radio broke broadcasting history on June 28, 1989 when we became the first to broadcast the same programming on two different FM frequencies. 103.5 FM is the powerhouse at 50,000 watts and 98.3 FM is at 3,000 watts. This would account for your being able to receive 103.5 and not 98.3.

SHO Radio's studios are located in downtown Schenectady with transmitters in Rotterdam and Pallatine Bridge, New York.

Both 98.3 and 103.5 were bought by The RadioActive Group. Bob Penrod and Homer Carboneau are no longer with the station.
