This letter is to confirm your reception of WVIA-FM on Thursday, September 26, 1985. WVIA-FM serves northeastern PA and parts of the southern NY and northern NJ on a frequency of 89.9 MHz. Our transmitter is located on Pennobscot Knob in Mountain Top, PA (1250 AAT) at a power of 50,000 watts. Enclosed, please find additional material on the station.

Our area was rather hard hit by hurricane Gloria and the immediate area was without water for a week due to a break in a main from a reservoir that is our main supply. The description that you provided of our programming was very accurate. Libby Smith was paying tribute to Gershwin on his birthday.

It was a great pleasure hearing from you and everyone here at the station got a big kick out of knowing that the signal actually travelled that far. It will give us something to tell some of our listeners who live in fringe reception areas and complain that their signal isn't always clear.
