This letter is hopefully enough to confirm your reception of WJMF, between 1:22 a.m. and 2:39 a.m. on Thursday, August 20, 1981.

I'm sorry we "ignored" your last letter. As a college radio station, the manpower isn't usually there to take care of the mail properly. I am very surprised, however, that someone didn't take notice of it, because we are very anxious to see how far our new 225 watt signal reaches.

That particular evening, you were listening to Dana Puopolo, who, though not black, is the station's Chief Engineer. After what is often a long day doing his regular job at WLKW, he's usually pretty beat by the time his lat-night show comes around.

Though I have no coverage map, I can give you a rough idea where WJMF can generally be heard--our signal reaches all of Rhode Island, most of Southeastern Massachusetts, and Eastern Connecticut. Your reception is the farthest east, and the station has been heard as far north as Worcester, Massachusetts.

Thank you for your letter, and please continue to, as we say, "go down on your radio--all the way down--to FM 89." Also please find a copy of our fledgling monthly program guide, FM 89 News.
