This is to confirm your report of reception of WRJA-FM at 11:53 a.m. on July 2, 1985. A check of the program logs agrees with the report you give. Thank you very much for your interest and report. Notices of DX reception are always of great interest here at South Carolina Educational Television and Radio, as most of the engineering staff in the network are Ham Radio operators, as I am (WA4UMU). The transmitter is an RCA BTF-20E1 running 19,500 watts into an omni-directional antenna at 1000 feet AGL, 1150 feet AMSL. The antenna is colocated on a 1200 ft. tower with WRJA-TV, Channel 27. Effective radiated power of WRJA-FM is 100,000 watts.

Sorry for the delay in confirming your reception report. We have been extremely busy installing and de-bugging a new computer remote control system for two nearby ETV stations. Please let us know if you ever hear any of the S.C. Educational Radio stations in the future.
