Please forgive the delay in answering your letter dated June 14 of this year. Yes it was a signal from our station that your picked up on your equipment.

A short history of our station. We are a radio reading service of the Memphis Shelby County Public Library and Information Center with funding provided by our local, state, and federal money, as well as private donations. Our signal is broadcast a radius of 35 miles around Memphis. Our target audience is print impaired people, which estimates into about 200,000 people in the Memphis area.

I do not have a coverage map to send you but I am enclosing a program guide for your records. This guide will give you an indication of just what it is we read over the airwaves to our listeners.

Our station is 89.3 on the FM dial. We've been main channel for over a year now, having served the print impaired over closed circuit for more than 12 years.

We appreciate your letter and now I guess we can boast that we're "heard on the eastern coast".
