Thank You for your letter noting your reception of WCFR FM at 93.5 Mhz. We're always pleased to learn that our signal is sometimes heard out side of our immediate listening area.

Let me introduce myself as Bill Salati, the announcer you heard after the 10:00 AM weather with Tony Vazzano. In my teenage days I also used to sit with and old National NC 57 receiver and listen to AM stations around the country.

WCFR FM operates 24 hours a day with a Harris transmitter into a four element antenna. Transmitter output is 1900 Watts, with an effective radiated power of 3000 watts from our 300 foot tower. WCFR FM has operated in stereo since 1976.

WCFR AM is a 5000 daytime operation with all programming simulcast with WCFR FM.


Your listening report is quite accurate, the only confusion I can determine would be for Jerry's furniture outlet, and fireworks on murray hill. these are probably comments from North Conway that faded into ~~our~~ signal. Also the pick your own strawberries were from Peachblow farm.

By the way, the FCC has informed us that WCFR AM can operate post sunset with 24.6 watts. Unfortunately we have not yet devised a way to do so. More poer to us indeed!
