Dear Mr. Cooper:

We received your letter of July 18, 1991 concerning the reception of our FM radio station WOKO at Provincetown, MS.

WOKO operates on 98.9 Mhz with 100,000 watts 24 hours a day. Our format of "Continuous Country" is live, using 100% compact disks.

Our station came on the air May 1962 with 3,000 watts under the call letters WJOY-FM. It was then and now, a sister station to our 1,000 watt AM station WJOY. WJOY-FM was the only commercial FM radio station in the State of Vermont for seven years until April 1969. WJOY-FM also was the first Vermont station to broadcast in stereo and also in "Quad". In 1972 the call letters were changed to WQCR (FM). Transmitting power was increased to 33,000 watts in 1975 and again raised to 50,000 watts in 1978. The transmitting power was raised to full power of 100,000 watts in September 1988. From February 14, 1975 to April 1, 1990 the station was formatted rock. On April 1, 1990, at 1800 hours, the call letters and the format were changed to WOKO (FM).

Your report of reception of WOKO on July 18, 1991 from 0138 to 0152 hours is hereby verified.
