I am pleased to report reception of your station on March 26, 1974  
from 6:00 a.m. to 6:01 a.m. Central Daylight Time on 1190 kcs.

Items and announcements heard on this broadcast are as follows:

6:00 Sign On Announcement-"W A Y D, Ozark, Alabama.....W A Y D operates on its assigned frequency of 1190 kilohertz with a power output of 1,000 watts as authorized by the Federal Communications Commission in Washington, D.C."

I am sorry that this is not a more detailed report, but your signal was quickly covered by the interference.

This is a follow up report to your station. I mailed a reception report to you shortly after the above reception, but no reply was ever received. Perhaps, it was lost in the mail.
