Dear Sir:

I am pleased to report to you my reception of your Radio Station on 1470 kilohertz this morning, February 11, 1977 from 1:47 a.m. to 1:57 a.m. Central Standard Time. The following is a summary of my reception:

- 1:47 A very low frequency test tone.
- 1:50 Pause in tone for identification-"This is W B L O, Evergreen, Alabama...".
- 1:51 The Tone continued.
- 1:55 Pause in tone for identification-"This is W B L O, Evergreen, Alabama.....and we are conducting our regular monthly frequency test. This is W B L O, 1470 on your dial in Evergreen, Alabama".

The signal level of W B L O during the above period varied considerable, from a poor S-2, to a good S-7. There was interference from both K L C L in Lake Charles, Louisiana, and an unidentified Spanish-Speaking station. My receiver is a Hammarlund HQ-180AC which has 18 tubes. My antenna is a 2' Directional Alatzmuth Loop.

Please kindly look over the details contained in the above report. If you find them to be correct and to your satisfaction, I would appreciate receiving a brief letter or card stating that my reception of W B L O is verified. I have 1,896 verifications, including 48 from the State of Alabama. Yours would be a most welcome addition to my collection. I have enclosed return postage for your convenience in making a reply.
