KXLR operates with a daytime non-directional power of 5000 watts on 1150 kc. Our nighttime power is 1000 watts with a four tower in line directional array. Our nighttime coverage does not send a signal in your direction since we are protecting station KSAL in Salina, Kansas.

I was very glad to hear that you heard us in Omaha, Nebraska. We hear from a lot of listeners in the east of us, but, few in your direction due to Salina, Kansas on the same frequency.
