Dear Mr. Dabelstein,

Thank you for your letter concerning reception of station KDKB-AM in Lincoln, Nebraska.

The information submitted in your reception report is sufficient to indicate you were indeed receiving station KDKB^{AM} at the times you have stated on February 2, 1972 from 1813 hours until 1815 hours.

In August of 1971, radio station KMND AM & FM were sold to Dwight Karma Broadcasting Company. The call letters of KMND were changed to KDKB AM & FM. The AM station originally came on the air in October of 1962 with the call letters of KALF. In 1968 we constructed a new FM stereo station on 93.3 Mhz and received the call letters of KMND for the FM. In 1970 the owners and management at that time decided to apply to the FCC to have the AM call letters changed to KMND AM, & this was rapidly granted by the FCC. We operated as KMND AM & FM until August of 1971 when the two stations were sold and the above call letters granted.

It might interest you to know that we also have received a reception report for the FM station while the call letters were still KMND, from Lincoln, Nebraska.

The AM station operates from local sunrise until sunset on 1510 Khz with 10000 watts of power. For the month of February these local times are 0715 until 1815 hours MST.

Thank you for the reception report and the best of BCB DX to you for 1972.
