Dear Mr. Dabelstein:

Thank you for your recent reception report of Radio C-FUN. Your programming report was correct and your technical report quite interesting.

Radio C-FUN broadcasts from Vancouver, B.C., Canada on an assigned frequency of 1410 KHz with a power output of 50,000 watts, day and night, with a pattern change at night. Broadcasting is normally done with an R.C.A. BTA-50HI transmitter into a three tower antenna array located in Delta, B.C. Emergency standby facilities include an R.C.A. 10 KW transmitter and two tower antenna array located on Lulu Island in Richmond, B.C. Both transmitters are situated just south of Vancouver.

C-FUN is programmed principally for the young adult (18 - 50) audience. We are the oldest continuously broadcasting radio station in Vancouver and celebrated our 50th Anniversary in 1972. The call letters were changed to C-FUN on September 30, 1973, having previously been CKVN.
