Our AM transmitter is an R.C.A. BTA 5F which was installed new in 1945. It provides a power level of 5 KW at the base of our antenna.

The antenna is an array of 2 towers 5/8 wavelength high at our operating frequency of 1330 KHz. We use the East tower only during daylight, non directional. Nighttime, both towers are used as a directional array with major radiation approximately South to Northeast.

The FM transmitter is at the top of Mt. Wilson. The effective radiated power is 59 KW.

Our pleasure (and our business) is classical music, which we provide Los Angeles 24 hours of every day.

Some of our regular listeners on AM are located as far away as Arizona, Nevada and Central California.
