Dear Sir:

I am writing to inquire about the possibility that I was receiving the signal of your radio station on 1530 kilohertz this evening, March 4, 1984, at 7:00 p.m. I just happened to be tuning across the frequency and heard the following ending portion of a sign off announcement:

"...Colorado Springs based firm is now ending another broadcast day. Join us again tomorrow morning at 6 a.m. for another full day of entertainment, and thank you for joining us."

This sounded like a canned sign off, and I would appreciate your checking to see if it indeed was K C M N.

During my brief reception the signal was completely in the clear. Had I tuned in sooner, I am sure I would have heard clearly the entire sign off.

My receiver is a Hammarlund HQ-180A and my antenna is a directional alt-azimuth loop.

If you check the above portion of sign off and find that it was indeed KCMN, I would very much appreciate receiving a brief letter or card stating so. I have 2,198 verifications, including 75 from Colorado. Yours would be a most welcome addition to my collection. I have enclosed a stamp for your reply. Thanks for your time.
