Dear OM:

Wish to confirm your reception of our station...W R C D, on the morning of 16 December, 1976 (Thursday), at approximately 6:00AM Eastern Standard Time.

Data submitted agrees with our program log. Equipment in use here at W R C D consists of the Gates BCI-F 1 Kw. AM transmitter, together with all associated remote control and studio components, mostly Gates also.

This past October (1976) marked the 22nd anniversary of W R C D's emergence as a broadcast outlet for Dalton, Ga. Our license calls for daytime operation only, however, due to our regional frequency status, we are permitted to sign on, year 'round, at 6:00AM EST or EDT whichever the case may be. Sign-on power output is 500 watts; then from local sunrise to local sunset, operating output power is 1 Kw.

I notice your ham call, and wish to note that I operate as K4PNP, since 1957, using an HT-37 Hallicrafters phasing-type sideband transmitter, and a Collins 75S3B receiver. QRP transceiver is a Ten-Tec Argonaut, with 5 watts input. Stand-by transceiver is a Heath HW-100. Antennas: a center-fed Zepp for 40 and 80 and a Mosley Classic "33" tri-band beam for 10-15-20. Also a Hy-Gain 18AVT-WB vertical for 10 thru 80 as a standby.
