We were very happy to get your report on our reception in Lincon, Nebraska. As far as we can tell you have heard us correctly. That which you quoted is our sign off announcement as you indicated. Thats not bad for a thousand (1,000) watts! Of course we realize that you wouldn't have heard us if it were earlier in the day. KBLI is a daytime station as you probably know. Being on a clear channel frequency gives us the advantage of very good coverage for our power. Our coverage is larger than some 5kw stations in the area.

I am also answering another request for varification today. This will be the second time I have answered this particular request. The first one must have been lost in the mail. It is to a Mr. Alan Imprescia, 245 East 19th Street in New York City who heard us on June 28, 1972. He listened to us for about half an hour just before sign off on that date.
