Thanks for your report. I grew up in Omaha, went to Central High School, and worked at KOIL in the early '30s.

WIND uses a four-tower directional antenna system, transmitting its maximum signal to the northwest from its transmitter near Gary, Indiana.

WIND installed its first directional antenna in 1934. It was the only such system in the middle-west at that time.

WIND was the first station in Chicago to operate 24-hours a day.

WIND is the only station in Chicago with duplicate main transmitters. Both are modern and complete in all respects, transmitting with 5,000 wafts, the maximum power permitted on regional channels.
