Dear Sir:

I am pleased to be able to report to you my reception of your radio station on 1330 kilohertz this morning, October 1, 1983 at 6:00 a.m. Central Time. The following is a summary of my reception at that time:

6:00 Sign On Announcement-"Good Morning. This is W V H I Evansville. W V H I is owned and operated by Geiger(?) Broadcasting Company, Incorporated and is licensed by the Federal Communications Commission to operate on a frequency of 1330 kilohertz with a power of 5,000 watts days and 1,000 watts at night. The studios and offices of W V H I are located at the corner of 4th and Sycamore in Downtown Evansville.

When did you change your call letters. I didn't see anything listed in Broadcasting about a call change for your station.

During my reception your signal was on top of the frequency, but there was quite alot of interference from K F H in Wichita, Kansas. My receiver is a Kenwood R-1000 and my antenna is a 12" ferrite core altazmuth loop.

If you find this report to be correct and to your satisfaction, I would very much appreciate receiving a brief letter or card stating that my reception of WVHI is verified. I have 2,188 verifications, including 45 from the Hoosier State. Yours would be a most welcome addition to my collection. I have enclosed a stamp for your reply. Thanks for your time.
