Gentlemen:

I am pleased to report reception of your station on October 29, 1973
from 5:45 a.m. to 5:46 a.m. Central Standard Time on 1580 kcs.

Items and announcements heard on this broadcast are as follows:

5:45 Sign On Announcement-"Good Morning. This is W A X U in Goergetown, Kentucky operating on an assigned frequency of 1580 kilocycles and with a power of 10,000 watts authorized by the Federal Communications Commission in Washington, D.C. W A X U is owned and operated by Central Kentucky Broadcasting Corporation with transmitter and studio located on Iron Brick Road in Scott County"

This is a follow up report to W A X U. My original report was never answered, however, several fellow National Radio Club members have recently reported receiving correspondence from W A X U, so perhaps my letter was somehow lost in the mails.

If you find this report to be correct and to your satisfaction, I would appreciate receiving a brief letter or card stating that my reception is verified. I have 1,526 verifications, including 35 from Kentucky. Yours would be a most welcome addition to my collection.
