Dear Sir:

I am pleased to report to you my reception of your radio station on 1570 kilohertz this morning, April 5, 1977 from 4:22 a.m. to 4:35 a.m. Central Standard Time. The following is a summary of my reception during this monitoring period:

4:22 A test tone.

4:26 Station Identification-"This is W K Y R.....".

4:27 The tone continued.

4:29 Station Identification-"This is W K Y R Burkesville, Kentucky on the air for a frequency measurement check".

4:35 Station Identification-"This is W K Y R now leaving the air".

During the total period of reception, the test tone came through the interference quite well, but the modulation was very low. X E R F in Mexico was the biggest problem, with some help from station C H L O in Ontario, Canada. Generally your signal level was at an S-5. My receiver is a Hammarlund HQ-180AC which has 18 tubes. My antenna is a 2' Directional Altazimuth Loop.

Please look over the details above. If you find this report to be correct and to your satisfaction, I would appreciate receiving a brief letter or card stating that my reception of W K Y R is verified. I have 1,909 verifications, including 47 from the Bluegrass State. I also have a verification letter from a W K Y R when the letters were used by a station on 1270 kilohertz in Keyser, West Virginia. Yours would be a most welcome addition to my collection. I have enclosed return postage for your reply.
