Gentlemen:

I am pleased to report reception of your station on October 23, 1973

from 5:57 a.m. to 5:58 a.m. Central Daylight Time on 1350 kcs.

Items and announcements heard on this broadcast are as follows:

5:57 Sign On Announcement-"Good Morning. Station K T M F...welcome you to another day of local, regional and world news as well as sports, weather, and music. K T M F operating by the authority of the Federal Communications Commission on a frequency of 1350 kilohertz with a power of 500 watts...throughout the day on K T M F...."

I am sorry that this report is not more detailed, however, the interference on the frequency was just too great. I have enclosed a brief tape recording of my reception so you can have some idea how your signal came in.

If you find this report correct and to your satisfaction, I would appreciate receiving a brief letter or card stating that my reception is verified. I have 1,486 verifications, including 52 from Minnesota. Yours would be a most welcome addition to my collection.
