This letter will serve as verification of your reception of KBSM Blue Springs, Missouri on February 5, 1984. I know your log is correct because I was the person on air at the time. My role at KBSM is working on air Sunday nights as well as Chief Engineer. This is a secondary job, I also work at WDAF-TV as a fulltime microwave engineer.

KBSM is a 1kw day, 500 watt night 24 hour operation using a 3-tower directional array. Our studio is located at 1030 West South Outer Road and our transmitter is at 2201 Porter Road, both in Blue Springs. Our feed to the transmitter is by a 949 MHz microwave link. KBSM signed on at Noon, February 2, and leaves the air Sunday nights at midnight for engineering maintenance.

Thank you for your report. I have enclosed a coverage map showing our pattern. Good luck in future receptions.
