
Hi Skip,

Thank you for your phone call and tape of our KOKO DX Test, and I'm happy to provide you with a second and unsolicited verie of our station. You were indeed tuned to KOKO between 2:00 and 2:30 A.M. on Monday morning, January 21, 1974. It sounded like we were coming into the Lincoln area better than into Omaha. Ernie also sent a tape of the DX.

We were very pleased with the results as we received 23 reports from 12 states and Manitoba. The four most distant were all right at 1,000 miles; from David Thomas in Tampa, Tom Sundstrom in New Jersey, Kermit Geary in Pa., and Daryl Belanger in Manitoba. The first three got only CW IDs, but Belanger sent an amazing good tape. Illinois was first with five reports, with Nebraska right behind at four. Neil Zank & Bill Nittler were the others reporting from Nebraskaland. Two of the Illinois reporters were within six miles of WVON which was on! They must not get out well anymore, as I used to hear them regularly on MM, but haven't for a long time.

I'm still, as of this writing, holding up the round robin tape, but I hope to get on the stick this weekend. Thanks for all the DXes you've arranged this year. KAVI just barely sneaked through with an ID for a much-wanted one. I'll be trying for the two upcoming ones. Continued good DX to you, and please come see me any time the opportunity arises.
