Dear Carl,

This will confirm your reception of Radio Station KUKU, Willow Springs, Missouri, on the frequency of 1330 KHz, between 1:30 AM and 2:00 AM, Central Standard Time, February 26, 1979.

Our transmitter is an elder Gates, BC-lJ, eperated at 1000 watts, into a 110 feet, series excited vertical tower, with ground system consisting of 120 buried copper wire radials 185 feet in length.

Sorry for the delay in answering Carl. I have gotten all the reception reports we received with this letter. We received reports from PA, VA, CO, WV, IL, TX, MA, LA, IA, NB, GA, OK, WI, NY, OH, and Ontario, Canada! I was also susprised at the number of phone calls we received while conducting the test.

I handle the engineering here at KUKU part-time, being employeed as a radio operator by the Missouri Highway Patrol at Willow Springs. It was a pleasure conducting the test Carl and I'll be happy to do another anytime. I hope to catch you one of these days on 40 meters.
