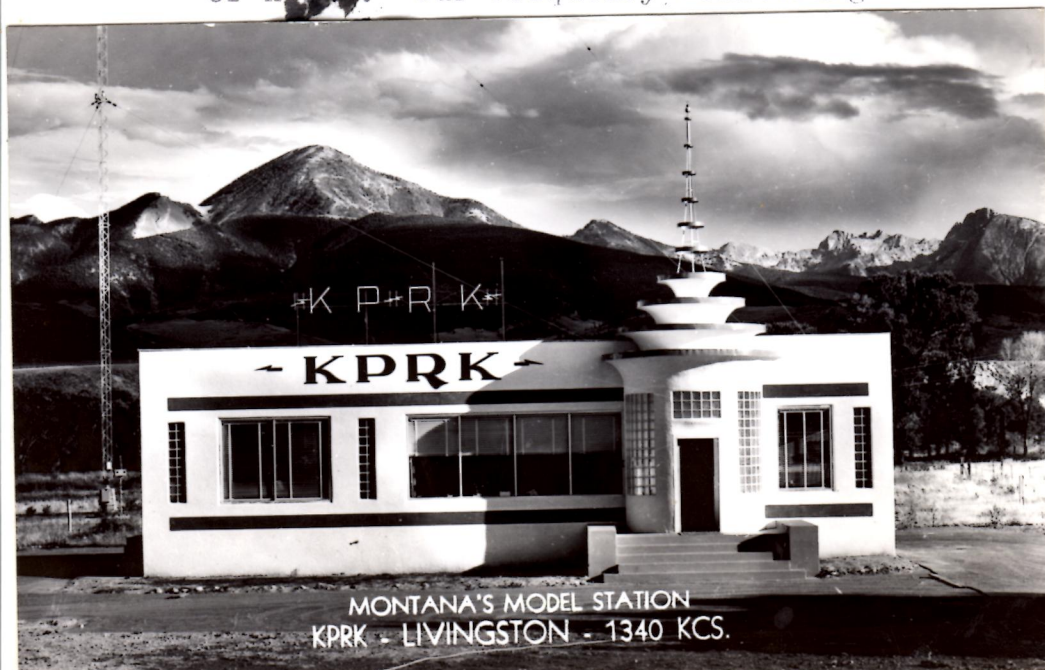

MR. Dabelstein:

According to our tech logs we were on the air from one a.m. to one thirty, Mountain Standard Time, which would confirm your reception of our frequency check. At that time we were operating on one kilowatt, non directional. I don't feel the interference should have been bad at all. As 1340 is a local channel, all stations, except those in the Pacific Time Zone should have been shut down. On Sunday nights, I was under the impression that the FCC required all stations to close up after midnight. The object was to be for all of these one hundred fifty odd stations on 1340 to conduct frequency checks.

If you would be interested we now have frequency checks done quarterly, and I believe August is the month for another check. We have checks on the Second Monday morning of the month. We generally are on the air some where between two and three a.m., Mountain Daylight Time. Our Signal does pretty good that time of night. Our Frequency Monitoring Service is in Lees Summit, Missouri, Dallas Texas and Vancouver, British Columbia. Let us know.
