Dear Mr. Dabelstein:

Steve Poole is no longer Chief Engineer for WEWO. Since he left another engineer has come and gone. I found your letter in the piles of paper on the desk about four weeks ago. Today I was able to find proof that we were the station you received on February 23, 1976. Dave Bennett, who was the engineer at the time of the test kept a file on all the reception reports he received. Your first letter is not in the file, it ~~must~~ have gotten lost in the mail. Your second letter is in the file however. Since the file is labeled "Reception Reports - Answered" he must have written you a letter. Either it got lost before it got to the mailbox or it got lost in the mail. I've noticed that the ~~address~~ on your last letter is different from the one on your second letter. Maybe he sent the letter soon after you moved. Not having all the facts I have no way of knowing for sure. I do confirm your reception report on the basis of records from that time.

WEWO is owned by Curtis + Associates who acquired the station in 1969. The station first signed on in 1947 as a 1000 watt daytimer. In 1965 authorization to operate at 5000 watts during non-critical hours was obtained from the FCC.

Our transmitting equipment consists of a 1947 Raytheon RA-1000 transmitter which was used full time (when on the air) when you received our test. It is now used only on Sundays when we're on low power, and as a stand-by when our new transmitter cuts out, which is not very often. We now use an RCA BTA-5H.
