Dear Mr. Dabelstein:

This letter will confirm your reception of KKAR-AM, $1180~\rm kHz$, from $7:35\rm AM$ to $7:48\rm AM$ CDT, September 12, 1989. At the time, we were broadcasting our weekday morning locally-produced news show.

KKAR broadcasts news, sports, weather, and local and national talk programming 24 hours a day, seven days a week, with a news staff of about twenty. Our transmitter is a Harris SX-5 solid state unit. KKAR broadcasts with a daytime power of five kilowatts into a two-tower directional array; at night, power is reduced to one kilowatt into a four-tower array. The transmitter site is located a few miles east of Council Bluffs, Iowa, across the Missouri River from our studios in Omaha.

KKAR has been on the air since March of 1987, and we are pleased to be on your list of confirmed stations. If you are also involved in FM dxing, you may wish to try picking up our sister FM station, KQKQ, on 98.5 MHz.

Thanks for your letter, and good luck with future dxing.
