We have received numerous "DX" letters, but all have failed to give sufficient information for verification. All have been asked for further information on the reception, program and identification, and none has answered. (In the last four years.)

Thus, it is with great pleasure that this verification letter is sent. What you were hearing was a "Proof of Performance" measurement being taken. If you or other members of the "National Radio Club" would like to attempt to receive KSID I would suggest that the attempt be made from 00:15 to 00:30 on the Thursday following the second Wednesday of each month. We may be identified by a 1,000 cycle tone, interrupted at approximately 00:20 and 00:25 with our Call Sign. Information on our operating power, location and frequency is transmitted at the beginning and end of the test period. If further information concerning the time and dates of these tests is desired, please write.

Once again, my thanks and my compliments on your reception report.
