Dear Mr. Dabelstein:

My sincere apologies for the delay. Your postcard indicating lack of a verie sure hit the spot!

This letter will serve to confirm your correct report of reception of KBIM on 3 February 1963 at 0014 hours NST.

We had signed on erroneously on the wrong day for a frequency measurement transmission in cooperation with Commercial Radio Monitoring Co. of Kansas City, Mo. The correct day was supposed to be one week later. Oh well, they had me fooled too - I didn't wait for their usual postcard. Guess I never will learn!

We use a Collins 21E 5000 watt transmitter using a single 3X2500A3 modulated by a pair of AP, 3X3000A1s. The antenna is a single 248' tower. Audio equipment is mostly Gates. Except the compressor for recording commercials, it is homebrew, will appear pretty soon in Broadcast Engineering and perhaps 73 magazine.
