Dear Sir:

I am writing you in connection with my reception of W T N S. Some time ago I sent to you a report of reception of your station on 1560 kilohertz, which I heard on March 10, 1975 between 4:58 a.m. and 5:03 a.m. Central Daylight Time. I have awaited your reply, but have never received an answer to my letter. Several fellow National Radio Club members have received replies from W T N S from time to time. Perhaps my original letter was somehow lost in the mails.

The following is a summary of my reception during the above period:

- 4:58 The National Anthem was played.
- 4:59 Sign On Announcement - "Good Morning Everyone. This is W T N S AM in Coshocton, Ohio now signing on the air. W T N S & W T N S FM are both owned and operated by the Coshocton Broadcasting Company. W T N S AM broadcasts on an assigned frequency of 1560 kilohertz with 1,000 watts. W T N S FM operates on 99.3 megahertz with 1,200 watts effective radiated power, as authorized by the Federal Communications Commission. Our studios are located at 114 North 6th Street in Coshocton and our transmitter....of Coshocton"
- 5:00 The Christopher Thought for the Day.
- 5:00 The Coshocton Weather Watch.

The reception of W T N S was heard at an S-5(good) level with interference from W D X R in Paducah, Kentucky. My receiver is a Hammarlund HQ-180AC which has 18 tubes. My antenna is a 2' Directional Altazmuth Loop.

Please check the details above to your station log for the respective date. If you find this report to be correct and to your satisfaction, I would appreciate receiving a brief letter or card stating that my reception of WTNS is verified. I have 1,852 verifications, including 44 from Ohio. Yours would be a most welcome addition to my collection. I have enclosed return postage for your convenience in making a reply to this request.
