Dear Sir:

This letter verifies your reception of KRMC on September 21, 1974 between 7:41 and 7:45 PM CDT. I am sorry for the delay in sending this letter, but your original letter apparently was lost.

Our transmitter is a Collins 820D-1 1KW/250W operated in the low power mode. A resistor network is switched into the common point input to the phasor for our 7W pre sunrise operation. Enclosed is a drawing of our pattern. We have two towers, each 220 ft. in height spaced 403 feet (180°) apart. The southeast tower current is 74% as great as the current in the northwest (reference) tower. The current in the southeast tower leads the reference tower current by approx. 17° to achieve the required pattern. Our pattern is the same for both pre-sunrise and daytime operation, only the power is changed.
