Dear Carl:

Thank you for your letter dated August 18, 1987. I apologize for not responding to your letter dated October 12, 1983. Although I was not working here then, based on the information contained in your letter, I will confirm that it was CFGM 1320 that you received.

For your information, CFGM operates on a frequency of $1320~\rm kHz$ with an output of $50,000~\rm watts$ into $13~\rm towers$ of differing heights. The standby transmitter operates at a reduced power of $10,000~\rm watts$. The main transmitter is a Continental 317C2, while the standby is an older Gates model. Because we have two different transmitting powers $(50,000/10,000~\rm watts)$, we are classed as a DA2 station. The towers are located at Latitude 43-34'30''N, Longitude 79-41'05''W.

CFGM has been on air since 1957 and was Canada's first full-time country music radio station.
