
Back on the morning of September 26, 1989 I had the opportunity to monitor the signal of your radio station on 1210 kilohertz. Shortly thereafter, I mailed a report of my reception to the station, but have never received a reply. Thinking that my first letter may have gone astray, I decided to send this follow up letter. The following are the details of my reception:

- 7:51 A program promotional announcement for a football game between Aberdeen and the Tigers.
- 7:52 Recorded Country-Western Music.
- 7:55 A commercial spot for Versales General Motors.
- 7:56 A commercial spot for something in Mitchell.
- 7:56 A commercial spot for the Happy Chef Restrauant.
- 7:57 A program announcement for another football game. The announcer gave several sponsors including American State Bank and Joe's Pub.
- 7:57 Weather.
- 8:00 Identification Announcement-"KOKK in Huron. The time now is 8 o'clock."
- 8:00 ABC News.

Your signal was fairly strong with a trace of interference from KGYN in Guymon, Oklahoma. My receiver is a Kenwood R-1000 and the antenna is a directional altazmuth loop.

If you find this report correct and to your satisfaction, I would appreciate receiving a letter of confirmation on your stationery. I have nearly 2,400 verifications, including 36 from South Dakota. Yours would be a most welcome addition to my collection. I am enclosing a stamp for your reply. Thanks very much for your time.
